M.A.S.H



On February 28, 1983, the last original episode of M.A.S.H. aired on TV as a 2-1/2 hour special. It was a national event. It was seen by the largest audience ever to watch a single television program.

The characters in M.A.S.H. were all members of the U. S. 4077 Mobile Army Surgical Hospital. They were stationed behind the lines during the Korean War. The doctors and nurses there treated wounded soldiers sent to them from the front lines.

The living conditions for the people at M.A.S.H. were difficult and depressing. They got through it with a great deal of humor. Each half-hour episode was a different situation comedy.

Surgeons "Hawkeye" Pierce and B. J. Hunnicut constantly broke regulations. Maxwell Klinger did outrageous things

trying to get himself discharged from the army. Head nurse "Hot Lips" Houlihan, Dr. Frank Burns, "Radar" O'Reilly, Colonel Potter, Major Winchester, and Father Mulcahy were other characters in the weekly program.

Although the characters and the stories were fictitious, the program was based on a real war in Korea. It lasted from 1950 to 1953. The war was between the South Koreans and the communist North Koreans. The U. S. fought on the side of the South Koreans, and China fought on the side of the North Koreans.

Ideas for the program came from a novel written by a doctor who had served in one of the Korean War M.A.S.H. units. M.A.S.H. was a big hit on TV for 11 years. More than 15 years after it ended, reruns are still being shown.

California Bound!

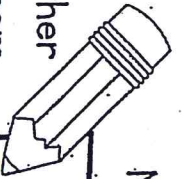
Clara pulled her bonnet up further over her head to shade her eyes from the sun. The trail was hot and dusty. She wondered what life would be like in California.
